TECH TIP


I had a junior high teacher call me recently to complain that the piano I had recently tuned for her was terribly out of tune with their Yamaha DX-7 synthesizer. I went with a certain suspicion, which turned out to be true. With my AccuTuner I found the DX-7 to be 75 cents flat. After hunting for a tuning adjustment on the instrument and reading the instructions to no avail, I called the manufacturer's service number. I was told the method, which is really quite simple: First, press the brown Function button and then button #1. Adjust the pitch using the Data Entry Slide Bar, then press button #6. Finish by pressing Internal Voice button, and Presto, you've tuned the DX-7. This could make you a hero as it did me, and I showed the teacher what might rescue her from a disastrous situation in the future before a concert.
