### Little Things

Often in our work it is the little details that make the big difference. I was reminded of this recently. I was working on a Steinway 'B' and the owner complained that it didn't feel "even" with the other notes. This is a piano that I had rebuilt and had taken great pride in my regulation, yet she pointed out the problem and after I swallowed my pride I could see that she was right.

What was the problem? A damper lever was engaging late, at about the same time as let-off (that will really make things uneven) and a hammer was engaging the heckcheck at a lower level than its neighbors. When those two

things were corrected the problem was gone, and I had a vivid reminder to watch the little details closely.

2. matted or manure-coated wool

3. any of various usually simple mechanical devices for holding, gripping, or fastening, etc.

I have never run across any manure-coated wool used to hold down a grand piano action. I therefore conclude that "dog" better describes what I do find being used for that purpose. So regardless of what many "Piano Tooners" say, I think "dog" is the word to use.

**EDITOR'S POSTSCRIPT:** I can't help but follow that with something I learned recently: How would you describe an agnostic, dyslexic insomniac? Maybe it would be someone who stays up all night wondering if there really is a dog.

TECHNICAL TIP:

I would like to share with you some developments from the ongoing saga of pinblock plugging. When drilling the 1/2 inch hole in the block, use a Forstner type flat bottom drill bit. This bit can be purchased at Westlake Hardware, or Ace Hardware, or any of the good mail-order tool stores. The cheap jobber-type drill bits tend to tear up the wood surrounding the hole. I learned the hard way.
