Chipping Away at Life

Do you sometimes feel overwhelmed by life? If so, you are not alone. Most of us have hectic schedules, multiple obligations and at least one "To-Do" list that seems frozen in time.

Recently I heard about a woman who remodeled her entire bathroom five minutes at a time. This led me to think about the clutter in my life: clutter on my desk, clutter in the shop, clutter on my schedule and that seemingly insurmountable list of obligations.

The first question is always where to start. In order to give yourself both a challenge and some hope at the same time, I would suggest picking two items that you can devote a small amount of time to each day until they are finished. Pick one that will be good for you and at least one that will give you a sense of pleasure when it is completed.

One of my new year's resolutions last year was to do more reading. It is easy to pick up a "who done it" novel. It is more difficult to read challenging literature. With all of the focus on the conflicts in the Middle East, I am reading A History of the Arab Peoples by Albert Hourani. This requires focus and concentration, so I am reading several spy novels to balance the approach. I'm also in the process of replacing the floor covering in a hallway. The carpet was easy to remove, but a previous homeowner had laid nine-inch square tile over the hardwood floor with a "protective layer" of tarpaper sandwiched between. After several attempts to find the right tool, I am using a sharp wood chisel to slice through the paper and scrape the adhesive off the hardwood flooring. I spend about 15 minutes each day clearing off a few tiles at a time.

Learning a new skill in our work is similar. Whether we are refining a new temperament sequence, learning to do polyester touch-up well, or understanding scale design, we face a learning curve. It may seem insurmountable at first, but if we chip away at it bit by bit we can learn the new skill.

Remember, this is also November, the month of the Thanksgiving holiday. It is easy just to sit down to a turkey dinner and watch some football without ever taking time to reflect on all for which we have to be thankful. As you are chipping away at life, pause to reflect and give thanks for all you have and all those in your life who have loved and supported you along your life's journey.
